## Donation to Mattersville/Pack 22

At the September meeting of the Margaret M Orr Circle #105, Ohio/National, we voted to send the proceeds of our Night at the Museum event at National Convention to a Veteran centered/Suicide Prevention program. I was given the choice of many programs, but we chose for our donation to go to Mattersville/Pack 22. Our circle donated \$350 to Mattersville/Pack 22.



This program is run by my nephew in law, Drew Robertson. He is married to my niece, Danielle. Mattersville is truly a unique place. It is in Colorado and provides veterans with a place where they receive a hand up, not a handout. With the help of beloved rescued wolves and wolf dogs, veterans can reenter the world with a purpose and a new "leash" on life. Veterans learn to be self-sufficient by learning valuable skills such as financial planning, construction, social adjustment, dealing with PTSD and other important skills. Veterans have to opportunity to build their own "tiny home" on the property. They only things that the veteran is responsible for is their food. The homes are completely run on solar. There are other programs such as Disaster Relief and Job Training programs.

Their "Heroes and Hybrids" program is centered on "pack healing". The wolves and wolf dogs come from very abusive situations. Veterans can interact with these wolves. Both need support and companionship. This improves mental health of both veterans and the dogs, therefore reducing the chances of suicide of our veterans. Currently, Mattersville is expanding into 6 other states!

Drew let me love the Spokeswolf of the pack, Randog. Randog is lovingly named in memory of Drew's best friend, Randy, a Marine veteran who sadly took his own life. Presenting this check was an emotional experience. Although small, Drew and Danielle accepted this gift with as much appreciation as if it was a million dollars. Cannot wait to visit this amazing place!!

**Remembrance Day in  
Gettysburg**

The LGAR is honored to have been in attendance of this ceremony, and to hear the Gettysburg Address on the 159th Anniversary in the same location it was originally given. It was a cold, but sunny, day as we commemorated the 159th Anniversary of Lincoln's Gettysburg Address. Key-note speakers included Dr. Allen Guelzo, Harold Holzer, and Jon Meacham. An additional layer of importance was added to this historic day as 19 new United States citizens were sworn in by officials from the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services.

The Ladies of the Grand Army of the Republic were honored to conduct a Memorial Service with floral tribute and the 2nd Brigade Cavalry Band at the 6th Ohio Cav Monument on Pleasanton Ave. The band played on original instruments, and parts of an original G.A.R. Memorial Service was conducted.


**A Historic Family Visit for William Boone Keith**

**Circle #3**

While no major battle of the Civil War was fought in Nevada, the territory was an integral part of that conflict. It provided financial support to the North from the silver mined in the Comstock Lode and rushed to become the 36th state in 1864 to help bolster Lincoln's election to a second term. Men initially joined California or units from other states but in 1863, the 1st Battalion, Nevada Cavalry and 1st Battalion, Nevada Infantry were formed. Most of these approximately 1200 men did not fight against the southern armies but protected the central overland route and settlements on the frontier especially from the Indians. Consequently, the members of the William Boone Keith Circle, #3 Nevada, usually have a family history that revolves around the eastern part of the country. Member Jodie Young has relatives in Kentucky whom she recently visited. Her Union ancestor is William Broughton who fought as a private in the Kentucky 24th infantry, Company A. Going on a ghost walk with her son at the Perryville Battlefield, she wondered if her ancestor fought in that battle. According to the Perry Battlefield Park Manager, Bryan Bush, William Broughton was not on the field when the battle took place.

The Confederate Monument has approximately 532 Confederate soldiers buried underneath it, many of which are unknown. Although Perryville Battlefield does not have any Union soldiers buried here, approximately 890 died on the Battlefield and were later interred in the Camp Nelson National Cemetery approximately 26 miles away.

**Isaac Rice Memorial**

On September 21st, the Corp Isaac Rice Circle 233 of the Ladies of the Grand Army of the Republic placed a wreath at the memorial stone of Corp Isaac Rice in Shreves Cemetery, Bedford County, Pennsylvania. Corp. Rice passed away while a POW on September 21, 1864.

Sister Tess Shimer of the circle was in attendance as was Marilyn Wallace who is an administrator for the Cemetery. The Cemetery was in beautiful condition! Sister Deb Miller gave a brief history of Corp Rice, read a poem, "Women of the War" and read a quote from Clara Barton's writings about Andersonville. The ceremony was closed with a prayer. Let us never forget our men and women who served.

Flag donations, veteran services, floral tributes, radio interview, and volunteerism occurred. Historical significance of colors during Civil War and present day. Ten foot veteran Christmas tree in community park display. Zoom technology enabled beloved 50 + year members Virginia Fosnaught and Mary May to welcome new members across the miles. 2023 plans underway include restorations, including GAR signage in PA's Everett cemetery.

**William Boone Keith Circle 3**

Dr. Linda Miller, William Boone Keith Circle #3 from Las Vegas, Nevada, portrayed for the 5th year the First Lady of Las Vegas Helen Stewart at the Civil War Re-enactment at Woodawn Cemetery in Las Vegas, Nevada May 30, 2022. Helen Stewart's grandfather was also a Union Veteran from Illinois. The program was coordinated by Shirley Dunphy president of Circle #3 and her husband Kurt Dunphy, Camp Commander Camp #12 Sons of the Union Veterans.

The focus of the event was to honor the memory of the two Civil War Soldiers, William Boone Keith Union (namesake of our Circle) and Joseph Moore Graham, Confederate, buried side by side. The ceremony was dedicated to the memory of Em Becker, former Tent 79 President of the Daughters of Union Veterans and her husband Len of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War Camp #12. They placed a marker between the graves of the two Civil War Soldiers in 1997 and were longtime caretakers. They both passed away in 2020.

Breakfast: For those staying at the hotel, please enjoy the breakfast buffet.



**Aurora GAR  
Memorial Hall**

The Aurora GAR Hall construction was completed in 1877 and was dedicated in 1878. This construction was inspired by a 1868 memorial building in Foxboro, Massachusetts. The money to build this hall was raised by members of the Soldier's Memorial Association formed in 1869 and the G.A.R. Aurora Post No. 20 formed in 1875 in order to erect a monument to honor those who fought for the Grand Army of the Republic. Built primarily from locally sourced limestone, community members donated most of the construction materials and labor, as well as the land where this structure stands. This historic building served as both a meeting hall for the GAR as well as Aurora's first public library until 1903 when Carnegie library opened nearby.



In the 1960's this gothic revival structure was slated for demolition, however as the news broke the surrounding community revealed other plans for the hall. In 1963 a fundraising campaign gave way to the complete restoration of this historic building. In 1984 this memorial was officially added to the National Register of Historic Places, a list of places, buildings, etc. recognized by the U.S. government as being worthy of protection and preservation due to historic significance.
