The Ladies of the Grand Army of the Republic (LGAR) is a historic, patriotic, and charitable organization founded in 1886. We are composed of women who are lineal descendants of honorably discharged Union veterans of the Civil War. Our organization preserves the memory of the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR) and the men who fought to preserve the Union, as well as supporting our current veterans and military.

We are proud to be one of the few organizations with a Congressional Charter under Title 36 of the U.S. Code, recognized as a 501(c)(1) nonprofit. This rare status reflects our long-standing commitment to service, patriotism, and historical preservation.

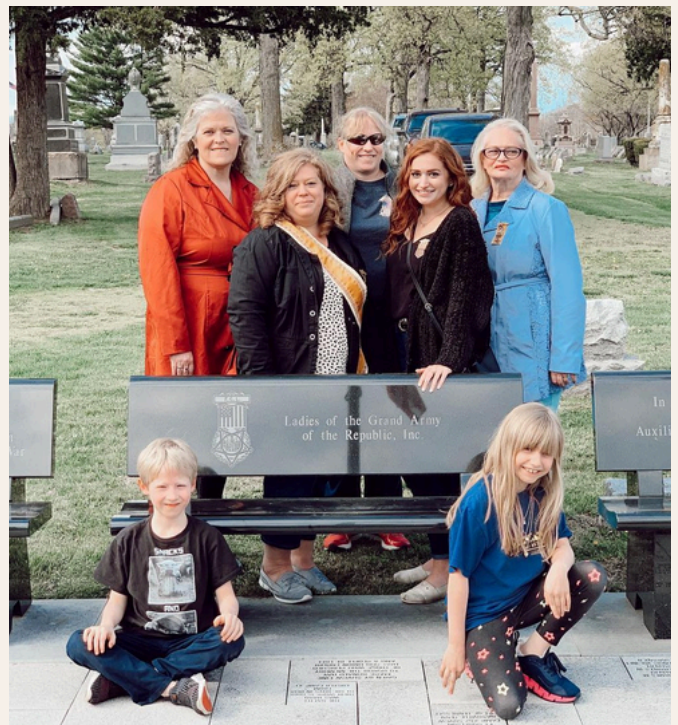
Our National HQ and Museum
