Remembrance Day | Gettysburg, PA

This November, members of the Ladies of the Grand Army of the Republic gathered in historic Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, to participate in the annual Remembrance Day events—a weekend dedicated to honoring Union soldiers, commemorating Abraham Lincoln's Gettysburg Address, and reflecting on the sacrifices that shaped our nation.

Our delegation began by paying respects at the Albert Woolson Monument, where National President Jan Stevenson and Department of Pennsylvania Senior Vice President Deb Miller laid wreaths in solemn tribute. Members gathered for photos and fellowship before the Remembrance Day Parade, a cherished tradition that unites hereditary organizations and descendants in honoring their ancestors' service.

Throughout the weekend, LGAR members also attended a powerful ceremony at Lincoln Cemetery, final resting place of unknown African American soldiers who fought at Gettysburg but were denied burial in the National Cemetery. The cemetery is also home to many influential African American citizens from Gettysburg's history. The ceremony served as a poignant reminder of forgotten stories, ongoing preservation efforts, and the importance of recognizing all who served.

Many members took part in the Gettysburg National Cemetery Luminary, where thousands of candles are placed beside the graves of fallen Union soldiers. The soft glow across the fields—paired with recitations of the names of those buried there—created an unforgettable and deeply moving experience.



The day prior to Remembrance Day, members toured the battlefield while following the diary of George Metcalf of Valley City, Ohio, retracing his firsthand account of the Battle of Gettysburg. Members also paused at various monuments connected to their own ancestors, offering quiet moments of reflection and gratitude.

Together, the weekend captured the very heart of our mission: remembrance, education, and honoring those who preserved the Union. (*pictures on page 4*)

William Boone Keith Circle 80th WWII End of War Commemoration

Dr. Linda Miller, of William Boone Keith Circle #3 in Las Vegas, Nevada, coordinated the 80th Commemoration of the End of World War II at the Atomic Museum on September 2, 2025. The event was sponsored by the Atomic Museum, where Dr. Miller is on the Board of Trustees, and Valley of Fire NSDAR, where Dr. Miller is the Commemorative Events Chair. The events on September 2, 2025, included an introduction by Dr. Linda Miller, a historical perspective of the ongoing impact of World War II on southern Nevada by Mark Hall-Patton, a docent tour of the exhibit, Manhattan Project Challenges and Consequences and the Official Live Stream Commemoration Ceremony Hosted by the Battleship Missouri Memorial.

After the ceremony, a remembrance of the late Circle President Shirley Dunphy was held in the History Walk where Circle members Dr. Miller and Barbara Yooungman dedicated a brick remembering the times she had been at the museum. Other Circle members attending included Suzanne West Ybarra, Julia Fontenot and Tina Bates.

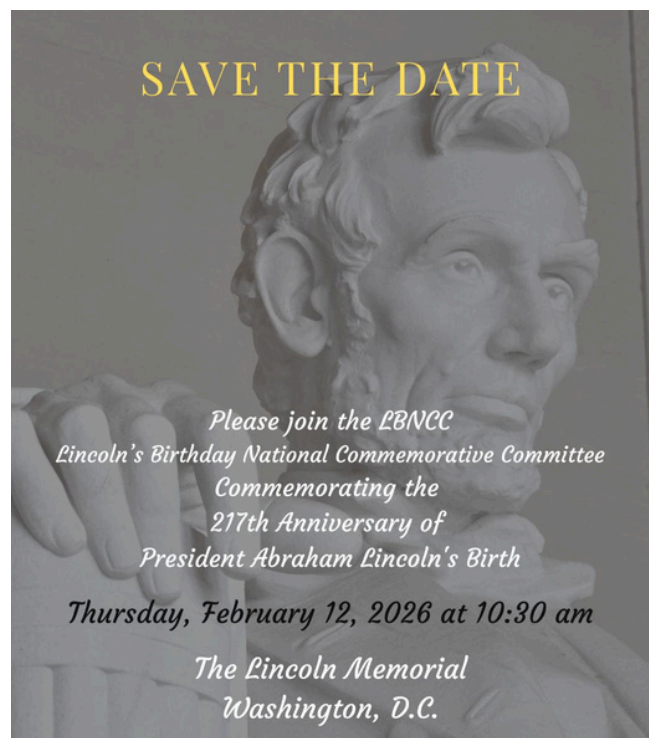

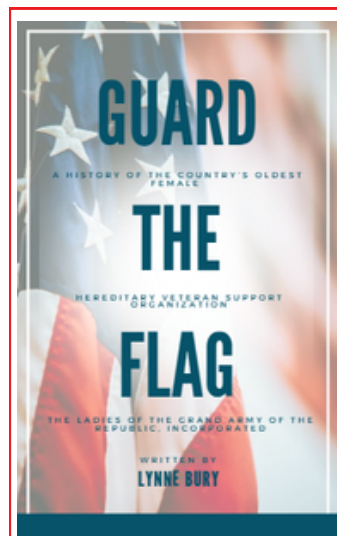
