# A Memorial Service of One

After the recent convention in Minneapolis, I explored some sites in the Twin Cities area. I was eager to see the memorial urn placed by the Minnesota Department of the Ladies of the Grand Army of the Republic in 1965 in the GAR soldiers' section of Longwood Cemetery in Minneapolis. I didn't feel I could go empty-handed, so I purchased some flowers before arriving. I stood alone in front of the urn, LGAR badge pinned to my blouse, read the American Creed and Articles of Faith, placed the flowers at the urn, thanked the ladies and the veterans for their service, then played Taps from my phone.

I then walked through the soldiers' circle and read the names on the stones. I jotted down a few names to honor them here: Pvt. William H. Blizzard, Co. K, 198<sup>th</sup> PA of Philadelphia; Corp. William Bowman Thompson, Pennsylvania 5<sup>th</sup> Veteran Volunteers. His obituary states the funeral was held "under the auspices of the GAR". Sgt. Calvin McClurg, Co. F, 191<sup>st</sup> PA from Dauphin County; William Day, Co. I, 193<sup>rd</sup> PA was born in Pittsburgh, and the funeral was conducted from his home by the James Bryant GAR post. Lastly, I'd like to recognize Pvt. Thomas C. Brackett, Co. A. 85<sup>th</sup> New York Infantry. He was one of our "Civil War Plymouth Pilgrims" serving at Plymouth, NC, alongside the 101st and 103rd Pennsylvania. Unfortunately, due to the timing, weather, and flight schedules, my Rice Circle sisters, Tess, Carole, and Gayle, were unable to attend my impromptu memorial service, although I know they dearly wanted to pay their respects. So, ladies, honor the sisters who have gone before us, even if it's just you, as a memorial service of one. I'm sure the ones gone before us appreciated it.

The sale generated over \$3,500 for veterans causes plus \$166 for Pets For Vets. The remaining items were donated to non profit organization: The Housing Project which helps the homeless move into apartments, two local nonprofit thrift stores that benefit the disabled and the general public including veterans, Hawk creek Animal Shelter, and Goodwill. A fantastic crew of 9 volunteers who were not LGAR affiliated helped.


